The needs in Stockport

Stockport is one of the most polarised towns in the UK with a number of specific needs and problems that the Trust aims to address.

- Areas like Brinnington, Adswood and Lancashire Hill are situated in the top 10% most deprived areas of the country.
- 2. More people are living in areas of deprivation than they did five years ago.
- 3. Where you live in Stockport can impact your life expectancy by over 10 years and more than 11 years if you are a man living in some northern areas of the borough.
- 4. 41% of people living in Stockport's deprived areas are inactive and do no regular physical activity.
- 5. 30% of primary school children in Stockport are classed as obese when they leave school.

- 6. Most primary school children in Stockport (51%) do no physical activity outside of school.
- 7. Over half of children receiving free school meals in Stockport do not meet their expected level of attainment when leaving primary school.
- 8. There is a rapidly increasing demand on mental health services for children in Stockport, which cannot be met by the NHS.
- Greater Manchester Police report increasing levels of anti-social behaviour in Stockport following the end of the Covid-19 pandemic.

10. Women in Stockport are not as active as men. Stockport has the highest gender inactivity gap in Greater Manchester at 6.6%.
